The View Up Ahead

"I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing." John 15:5

I want to thank everyone who helped prepare and attended our "Taste of Bell Baptists" Mission Event at FBC Belton on May 16th. We had approximately 265 people join us as we tasted ethnic and regional food prepared by 20 of our churches and 5 different ministries. We celebrated the graduation of seven UMHB certificate of ministry graduates. We were also encouraged by Dr. Roger Yancey's message about paying the price for missions. Dr. Yancey is currently serving as the Director of Missions in the Tryon-Evergreen Baptist Association in Conroe, Texas. The highlight of the evening for me was the prayer of dedication given by Tex Phipps for all the interns, teams, and ministries of our churches who will be involved in missions this summer and fall. More than twenty projects, in addition to Vacation Bible School and Sports Camps, are being planned by our churches in our area, in Texas, in the US and in the world. We are seeing our churches raise the level of their game and living out the Acts 1:8 mandate. Let's continue to pray for one another as we reach out to grow and impact lives in our world.

As I think of raising the level of our game, I am reminded of something I observed in my garden. I planted four cantaloupe vines. A week ago I discovered to my horror that a cut worm had mowed down one of the plants. Now I realized that my cantaloupe production was going to be down 25%. As an "agricultural investor" and fan of cantaloupes, that bugged me on several levels. I know that the Lord had a purpose for creating everything, but in my humble opinion cut-worms seem as useless as mosquitoes, ticks, and chiggers. On a more spiritual note, the lesson of John 15:5 was reinforced. In order to bear much fruit, we have to abide in the vine.

I began to speculate on some of the cut worms in our churches that keep us from "abiding in the vine" and "bearing much fruit." I have isolated several; Pride, Carelessness, Busyness, and Apathy. These sap our spiritual vitality and keep us from bearing much fruit. How do we deal with these spiritual cut worms?

1. Pray for Spiritual Victory
2. Model Spiritual Vitality
3. Encourage Spiritual Discipline

The stakes are too high to expect any less than the best from ourselves and our brothers and sisters in Christ. Now is the time to raise the level of our game and bear much fruit.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Director of Missions. It is my honor and privilege to serve the Lord through Bell Baptists and to watch as we take advantage of the opportunities we have to abide in the vine and raise the level of our game.

Michelle Del'Homme

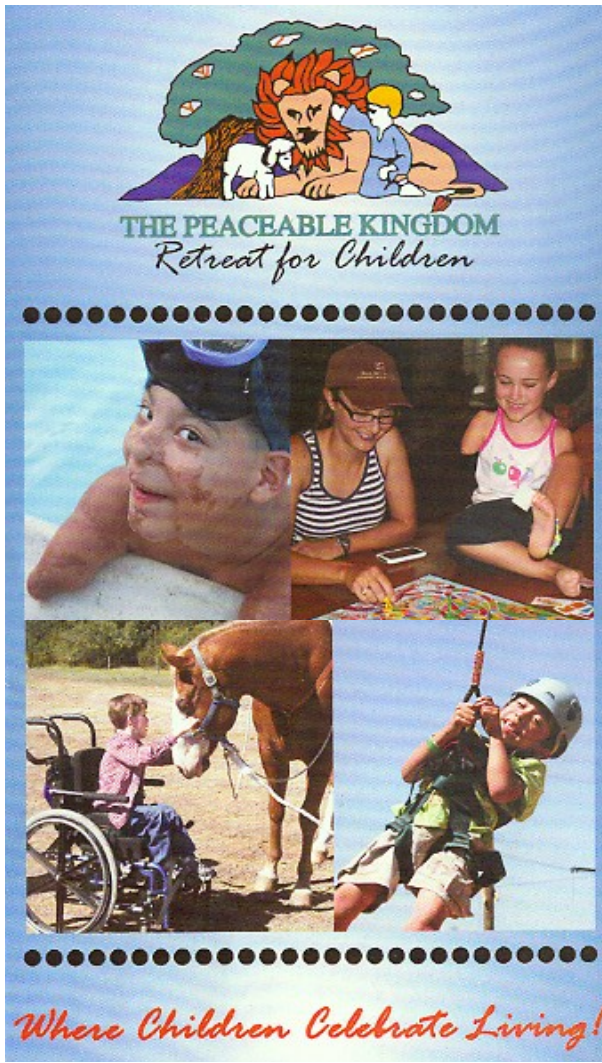

PKRC has a mission to offer a place where children with chronic illness or special needs, and their families, can celebrate the health-giving benefits of nature.

They have a four tiered approach to helping children.

The Environmental Education Program - provides an adaptive outdoor education curriculum for special education students in 1st-12th grades at over 20 Texas public school districts.

The Retreat Program - Sept-May allows hospitals, family groups, children's support groups and community groups to visit the retreat.

The Summer Camp Program - encourages children with chronic illnesses to participate in diagnosis specific camps.

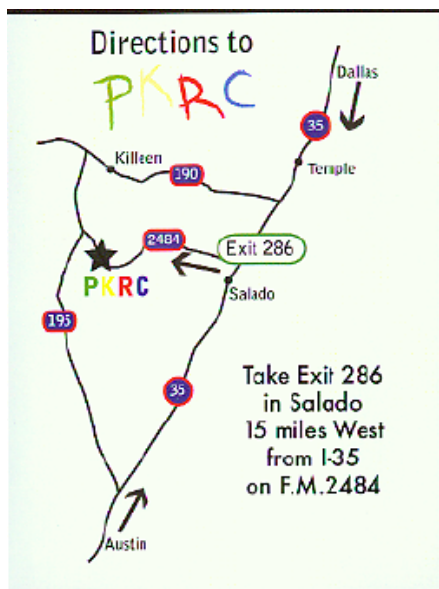
The Physical Therapy Program - a program designed to enhance rehabilitation through nature and a non-clinical environment.

They have a beautiful 100 acre retreat center with rock climbing walls, zip lines, dinosaur tracks, fishing areas, a pool with a ramp for wheelchairs, ropes course, sports court, bunk houses, game room, putt-putt course, rock garden (where many take their groups for prayer and quiet time), even a movie theater with a star studded ceiling. They have rock lined, paved walk

ways throughout the camp for all special needs wheel chairs and the visually impaired.

This would be a GREAT place to take your Sunday School class, Youth Group or Seniors to volunteer. Some of their greatest needs are for Kitchen help, Prep-Serve-Clean Up, Grounds Clean-Up, Retreat Center Beautification Projects, Costumes for talent night (they also need *audience* volunteers on Thursday nights during the summer). Volunteers are needed to help with lots of projects big and small! They have 60 beds in 3 cabins for overnight campers so supplies are always needed to keep the camp running.
